## **Complete physical**

- Schedule a complete physical at the time of adoption to check for internal and external parasites and overall wellbeing
- Sign up for pet insurance right away—this will maximize your coverage by avoiding pre-existing exclusions

#### **Vaccinations**

 Puppies need vaccinations every 3-4 weeks until they're 16 weeks of age

### **Nutrition**

- ▼ Talk to your vet about the best diet for your puppy
- No table scraps—they can lead to serious health problems, including obesity and pancreatitis

# House proofing

- Puppies love to chew and eat: when they get a hold of toxic plants, meds or forbidden food, that urge can be dangerous
- ♥ Buy chew-safe toys and invest in electrica cord protectors

#### Identification

- ♥ Puppies tend to get lost in unfamiliar settings
- If your puppy gets out, an ID tag and a microchip may be the only chance of finding home

#### **Training**

- A happy, healthy dog has good boundaries and healthy relationships with humans, dogs, and other animals
- Good training builds the foundation for a well-socialized pup
